Dear Berwyn Family,

This month, we honor the mothers in our lives as we celebrate Mother's Day. I would like to thank all the women who have accepted the significant responsibility of being a mother. We all bear a debt to you. The gratitude we offer this weekend to mothers barely expresses what we truly owe to our mothers. We thank you, and we love you.

Mothers instinctively tend to put everyone else first. They spend their days caring for people who are, at times, helpless to care for themselves. Often, it seems, Mothers spend so much time and energy caring for others that they may forget to care for themselves. Even after their children are grown, they may still operate like they did when they were small and helpless. It could be said that Mothers just do not know how to follow that familiar safety lesson we hear before a flight takeoff – “put on your own oxygen mask before assisting others!”

Remember when Mary and Martha had Jesus over as their guest and Jesus rebuked Martha? Caught up in the tasks she felt she must do to serve her guest, Martha forgot how much she needed to be present to receive the authentic Jesus. Her sister, however, chose the better option: having her soul fed by listening to Jesus. This Scripture reminds us of the importance of a mother taking the time to prioritize her own self-care.

We all need to feed our spirits. When we do so, we acknowledge we are finite creatures who cannot do it all, who cannot survive on our strength alone. When mothers pause from the stressors of life to pray, they are giving their children a positive example of praying and spending much needed time with the Lord.

Our minds and spirits need daily sustenance just as our bodies need daily nourishment. Without this, we become weak and undernourished in spirit and mind. When I feel starved in my spirit, my stores of hope, peace, and grace deplete. It is not wise to neglect to feed my heart with the grace of God; starving myself makes my spirit weaker. We cannot grow to be like Christ if we do not know him. And we will not know who Jesus is if we do not spend time with him.

In marriage, parents work to find the balance between the needs of their children and the needs of the couple's relationship. Their love for each other will create a home for their children filled with peace, kindness, security, and joy. Yes, their time with their children may be less, but the blessings are more. In the same way, mothers need to take time to grow spiritually, receive God's graces, and rest in God's loving arms. “Put on your own oxygen mask before assisting others!”

Your family may be doing things for you this weekend, expressing their deep love for you. Count on that love every day and not just this weekend, then take time to be with the Lord. Trust that your spiritual growth will be a powerful gift to all who know you.

To all the mothers in our congregation, I thank God for you and the loving ways you care, not just for your family at home, but for your BUMC family as well. We are blessed by every one of your giving and nurturing spirits! I pray you will take time to care for yourself this Mother's Day and always.

St. Paul was all over people of the church to give back. He would visit and write to various churches around the Mediterranean, even from prison making sure they knew, NOT that everyone is the same, but that contributing something is needed for the fellowship to thrive. He didn't want anyone to miss the importance of the fabulous gifts that participants bring to the faith community. He was very encouraging, straight forward and sometimes adamant on this point.

He loved to point out that people are different – good at different things. Some are good at prophecy (talking about what's important), some at providing service (looking after neighbors), some at making contributions (writing out generous checks), some at teaching (many things are complicated now), some at working miracles (fixing computers). [see Romans 11]. In all these ways, Paul says, every church friend is a critical part and all kinds of talents are needed.

It would have been good if Paul had included making MUSIC. It's always been part of faith community experience and persons who can and would make music are needed. We think back to the special music of Holy Week and Easter in April. The end-result of BUMC people singing along with hired musicians was wonder-filled and uplifting.

The music has and will continue to bless the BUMC community, thanks to John Lewis and music makers.
