Dear Berwyn Family,

As I write my final Lighted Cross letter to you, I am reminded of these words from Ecclesiastes:

There is a time for everything. and a season for every activity under the heavens: A time to be born and a time to die: A time to plant and a time to harvest; A time to kill and a time to heal; A time to tear down and a time to build up; A time to cry and a time to laugh; A time to grieve and a time to dance; A time to scatter stones and a time to gather stones: A time to embrace and a time to turn away; A time to search and a time to quit searching; A time to keep and a time to throw away; A time to tear and a time to mend; A time to be quiet and a time to speak; A time to love and a time to hate; A time for war and a time for peace.

- Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

Over the past three years, we have experienced a great deal together, much of which was unexpected! I remember the life milestones we went through together – the joy and the grief. I remember the weddings, the funerals, the babies who were born into your families, and the graduations. I remember the brunches, fall festivals, Bible Studies, Lessons and Carols, Candlelight Christmas Eve Service, 5th Sunday Pancake Breakfasts, Soupy Thursdays, and joyous Easter celebrations. I remember the singing, the worship, the praying, the preaching, and the fellowship and friendship. I remember how the pandemic turned our lives and congregation seemingly upside down and how we stayed strong in our faith to overcome the disruptions it caused - I remember it all!

There was some tearing down of old ideas and ways of doing things and the emergence of new ideas and ministries! There were some disagreements and some resolutions. There was some understanding and some forgiving. We developed a Food Pantry in our church and collected donations to stock it fully! We collected an abundance of coats for the Coat Drive every year. You demonstrated your immense generosity by donating Christmas gifts to children in need through Methodist Services and Mt. Zion United Methodist Church. We have laughed together and cried together. We have grieved and rejoiced together, and we have eaten way too much at memorable brunches! We funded and purchased an upgraded audio-visual system, which Zeo Systems will install in our sanctuary this month!

Through it all, we have loved each other and grown together while experiencing the goodness and wonder of Christ's grace, mercy, and eternal love! The Lord has been by our side and never failed to show us that God will make possible what we think is impossible.

As we reflect on the last three years and prepare to say goodbye to each other, I remain firm in my belief that God calls a pastor at a particular time, with a particular purpose, to a particular place, to a particular group of people and community. I am so proud of all we have accomplished together! My covenant with The United Methodist Church was always to serve you as an itinerant pastor. My commitment to itinerancy includes following God's calling for my ministry and preparing you for a new pastor who has also been called to Berwyn UMC at a particular time for a specific purpose. Let us not forget God's divine plan and that God is working in our congregations and lives. Let us hold firm in our faith that God will continue to work in this church to ensure it continues to fulfill its purpose and glorifies Christ.

When Jesus prepared to leave his disciples, he shared three promises:

First, Jesus promised to make a home in his disciples' hearts. "My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them." - John 14:23.

Then, Jesus promised the disciples that they would be filled with a spirit of comfort and courage. "The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." - John 14:26

Lastly, Jesus promised to sustain his disciples with true peace. "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you." - John 14:27

So, as Mary Lindberg says in her book, The Grateful Exit: A Pastor's Journey from Goodbye to Hello, "We'll open the gifts Jesus gave us—a home in him, the courage to move on, the peace that will get us through many unknowns. And we'll trust that God is staying with those we love for many more seasons."

I hope you know and remember that each of you will always be a part of me, and I will always be a part of you and this congregation. Thank you for the love, kindness, patience, grace, mercy, and generosity you have shown Lauren and me! Berwyn UMC is a special place, and you are a wonderful group of people we will never forget.

I will continue to pray for this congregation as you experience this time of transition and begin a new season. May you continue to grow in faith, hope, and love, worshipping the Lord with your whole self, and remember to do everything for the glory of God!

#### The NEW by Steve Cherry, Finance

The May issue of <u>Lighted Cross</u> included the 2022 Narrative Budget, a <u>NEW</u> form and a visual snapshot of how the various ministries and missions are funded. Since typical budgets cause most people to glaze over (though not so much for fussbudget wonks like a Finance Team Chairperson), a visual helps to highlight our financial ministry and stewardship. You may re-review the Narrative Budget on <u>www.BerwynUMC.org</u> website. There are those whose ongoing support provides a foundation for the congregation's operation. To these persons we offer deep ongoing thanks. But increasingly, we find that continuing with the programming we appreciate and expect requires special designated giving.

Stay tuned for installation of a <u>NEW</u> audio visual system for sanctuary, expected to be completed in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of the year. This will allow not only for improved sound, but includes two video monitors for posting hymn lyrics and visual augmentations for worship. This has been made possible through generous donations from friends and members of BUMC as well as the Annual Conference. This capital project is paid for outside the operating budget.

In the same way, promoting special ministries and emphasis. It's clear that, though this may seem to be **NEW**, stewardship and fund raising is needed throughout the year.
